

Crystal Angel

Ornament or Necklace

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The following supplies are found at your craft store in bead section or jewelry finding section. Sizes and shapes may. Choose what appeals to you. For larger beads consider wider ribbon for wings.

- Acrylic Teardrop color crystal - for body (pick shape and size you want – I used 20X24mm)
- Pearl - for head (hold size up to teardrop and see what size is best- I used 8mm)
- Small gold or silver jump rings - for halo (This will fit on top of head – I used 6mm)
- Silver cord thread – for hanging (purchase at craft stores in the needlepoint section - be sure it is thin enough to go doubled through bead holes)
- 3/8” Silver wired ribbon – for the wings
- Dental floss threader (found near toothpaste in most drug or grocery stores)

Cord thread length for necklace 28” long. Ornament 9” length.

1. Use a dental floss threader or a needle threader to pull thread through hole in teardrop (body). Pull thread to center so thread is even on both sides.



2. Rethread thread with both strands (body is attached).



3. Bring threads through head bead.
4. Place a drop of hot glue on the top of the teardrop to hold head straight.
5. Slide gold ring down thread and place a dot of glue to hold halo in place.

6. Loop a 5" length of ribbon like a bow. Trim ends at an angle.
7. Twist center of bow once so tails are both down. Glue ribbon to back of angel.



8. Tie a knot at top of thread for hanging.

Pictured below is another option for an Angel. Notice shape of body is different – it is also bigger. Head and body were constructed as above instructions.

- The arms are a ¼” wired ribbon pulled from back neck to center front and glued.
- A rose is glued in center front where hands would be.
- Wings are 4 glittered leaves (found in bridal crafts) twisted together and glued on back.
